Background

Digital Transformation initiatives are now common in most countries. Despite the worldwide diffusion of digital strategies, getting the claimed benefits has not been easy for various technological as well as organizational reasons. The challenge for researchers and practitioners is to ensure that the digitization in society leads to transformation and empowerment, and finally to positive, sustained development outcomes. Four waves of Digital Government innovations have emerged in the contemporary times: 1) Digitization – improving internal government operations and delivering better public services, 2) Transformation – facilitating administrative and institutional reform in government, 3) Engagement – engaging citizens and non-state actors in policy- and decision-making processes and 4) Contextualization – supporting policy and development goals in specific sectors and localities. Consequently, there has been significant interest in planning and on developing digital transformation best practices and applying them to ensure that these programmes and initiatives are on the right track and are more aligned to outcomes. A systematic process of planning improves citizen centricity, service orientation and transparency in public service delivery and leads to better inclusion of marginalized groups, women, and minorities. It can help identify opportunities for innovation and technology enabled transformation. This program has been designed with the above objectives. It would provide a broad multi-disciplinary view of digital transformation strategies. It would cover key concepts and best practices in the planning, design, requirement analysis, process re-engineering and impact assessment of digital transformation projects. It would also cover international best practices in citizen engagement, innovation in the public sector etc. Simultaneously, a comprehensive coverage of information security and data protection in relation to government/ public sector is planned. This programme is for Senior Professionals in Government and Public Sector. While the first week of the Programme is at MDI, Gurugram, the second week would be with our International partner at ESCP Europe London Campus. The programme will provide a platform for meaningful interaction and deliberation on opportunities and challenges in the areas of digital citizenship & public service, digital transformation & innovation.

Objective

Methodology

The programme will have a proper blend of case studies, simulations, presentations, lecture cum discussions, experience sharing, industry visits, group work etc. Participants are expected to bring specific problems/ issues pertaining to their own digital transformation projects which would be taken up in the group project work.

This area would be of interest to Senior Professionals in Government and Public Sector, policy makers, practitioners, banks, senior managers of transformation projects, senior business analysts etc.

Venue & Duration

The programme is scheduled during July 03-15, 2017. While the first week of the Programme is at MDI, Gurugram, the second week would be with our International partner, at ESCP Europe London Campus. The first week of the programme (03-07 July, 2017) is on residential basis at MDI Campus, Mehrauli Road, Sukhrali, Gurugram. Accommodation for participants would be available at MDI campus from the afternoon of July 02, 2017. The second week of the programme would be at London Campus (08-15 July, 2017).

Participants may be nominated by their organizations. About ESCP Europe - London Campus

ESCP Europe

Established in 1819, the world's first business school, ESCP Europe was founded by a group of economic scholars and businessmen including the well-known economist Jean-Baptiste Say and the celebrated trader Vital Roux..

The international scope of ESCP Europe has been visible since its early age. Already the class of 1824 counted 30% of international students with 15 different nationalities, amongst them seven Spanish, five Brazilians, five Dutch, four Germans, and two Americans. Language education was an essential part of its first curriculum which included, in addition to French grammar, also courses in English, German, and Spanish. As of 1825, a total of ten languages were taught at ESCP Europe and students had to study at least three of them.

Around one and a half centuries later, ESCP Europe was again a pioneer through the creation of a multi-campus business school. In order to respond to the School's European calling, campuses in Germany and in the United Kingdom were opened in 1973, followed by Spain in 1988, Italy in 2004, and Warsaw in 2015. In the context of an ever more globalized world, the ambition of ESCP Europe today is to train truly European managers by fostering the link between humanistic values and management education. ESCP Europe becomes a veritable European School open to the World.

ESCP London Campus

The London campus covers over 4,000 square metres, with the main part of the building dating back to Victorian times. There are twelve lecture rooms with seating capacities ranging from 20-150 people, and three breakout/seminar rooms for small discussion groups. In 2014 we added a dedicated Executive Education Suite to our teaching space, providing three additional lecture rooms. Computers are available for student use in the library, Trading Room and computer room, with a total of 63 computers and three printers. Wi-fi is also available throughout the building. Amenities include a student

lounge and recreation room, simulation trading room, language lab, campus cafe and a function space, the latter of which features a magnificent fireplace and stained glass window. The Chapel (so called because it was a place of worship back when our building was an ecclesiastical college) has the original vaulted ceiling and stained glass windows. The central courtyard provides an oasis within the School and is a social hub for staff, faculty and students alike on sunny days.

ESCP Europe students are very active in student associations, both within the School and in the wider community. There are limitless opportunities for social exchange and both personal and professional development through involvement in these associations, which create and organize several situations where students can exchange and share their experiences.
