


Background

- SEBI Mandates for top 1000 listed companies to submit Business Responsibility and Sustainability Report.
- SEBI mandates ESG schemes to invest at least 65 per cent of assets under management (AUM) in listed entities, where assurance on BRSR Core is undertaken.

Adoption of ESG Practices is increasingly becoming a competitive advantage and in certain cases, essential to enter international markets and receive investment globally. Therefore, even without regulatory pressure, organisations are adopting ESG frameworks.
